ARGL Review of 2019

Lyndale Fields, Preston

In early autumn ARGL was approached by rangers at South Ribble Borough Council with a request to help manage three ponds at Lyndale Fields, an area of public open space to the south of Preston. Common frog and smooth newt have been recorded there and management was required to prevent the pond edges becoming increasingly shaded. This work took place over three task days in November and December during which a huge amount was acheived. Many of the trees needed to be felled into the water and were dragged out by the volunteers.



Lyndale Fields, before and after: This was one of the pond edges where trees were cleared to allow more light to the pond margins. Tree stumps were left high as they will be re-cut and treated by South Ribble Borough Council.

2019 has been a relatively quiet year for ARGL, mainly due to the work committments of group members. However time has been well spent obtaining permission for pond management tasks in 2020. One of these is an exciting opportunity to work with HMP Wymott (near Preston) to help manage some of eighteen ponds on their land, a few of which support great crested newts. The volunteers will be removing trees casting dense shade over three ponds and advising on the management of others. This project arose out of work started in 2019 by Buckinghamshire ARG and presented at last year's HWM.
