











## MAKE IT!

Ask the children to roll it into a smooth ball on the table or in their hands. Squeeze cracks together and use more water if it dries.



Use a glue spreader or similar straight edged tool to make a zig zag pattern along the top of the snake. Make eyes and a 'V' shape on the head.



Use the glue spreader to make a hole through the middle to insert (plaited) wool to allow the child to wear it (when dry) as a pendant.



Roll the ball into a sausage shape – but don't make it too thin. Leave it no thinner than 1cm thick. Again, smooth with more water if needed.



CAREFULLY, coil the snake up, making sure the zig zag stays on top. Have the tail in the middle of the coil and the head at the end.



If desired, colour with marker pens, and add beads and wool when the clay has dried a little. Leaving the amulets in a warm place for an hour is sufficient for this.
