#### Time of year: March–October

Reptiles rely on heat from the sun to regulate their body temperature. Better chances in the spring (April to June) and autumn (mid-August to mid-October).

**BUT**, wall lizards are sun-lovers, and may be found throughout the year in sunny conditions.

Aim for three visits in spring (April – June), and two visits in autumn (mid-August – mid-October). Your sixth visit can be at any suitable time.

## When to survey

**Time of day:** Depends on the weather, but peaks of activity are generally in the morning and afternoon.

- Good conditions include days with sun or partial cloud between 10 and 20°C.
- Strong wind and heavy rain are generally bad, but sunny periods after rain can be productive.

Long periods of hot dry weather are not favourable (**but wall lizards may still be active**).



## Where to survey

Known and suspected wall lizard sites.

A site of your choice, or one provided to you.

Suitable habitats are often those regularly exposed to the sun and include dry stone walls, fort walls, steps, rocks, cliffs and quarries.

#### **Arranging landowner permission**

If you aren't the landowner, the coordinator will help you to identify and contact the owner to arrange permission to survey the site.

A template introductory letter for requesting permission is available.



## Equipment

- You will need
- a Reptilewatch JE Level 2 wall lizard survey form
- a pen or pencil
- a mobile phone (for use in the event of an emergency)
- Optional (recommended):
- a camera (a smart phone camera is fine)
- binoculars
- species ID guides
- Global Positioning System (GPS) / GPS phone app that allows you to record coordinates
- map of survey site



## **Preparation**

**Step 1:** Read, complete and return the Volunteer Working Agreement Form.

**Step 2:** Visit your site to familiarise yourself with the site and assess any risks.

Step 3: Identify either:

- a walking survey route that allows you to visually search most suitable parts of the site within ~30 minutes, or
- a fixed point from which you can visually search the habitat (e.g. using binoculars to search a large wall).

**Step 4:** Fill in your contact details and record the site details (name, location).

**Step 5:** Assess the connectivity and patch size of wall lizard habitat at your survey site.
